**Revenu Québec will be flexible with citizens who submit their tax return after April 30**

**Québec, April 15, 2021.** – Minister of Finance Eric Girard confirmed today that Revenu Québec will be flexible with citizens who submit their tax returns after the April 30 deadline. Thus, no late-filing penalty will be imposed and no interest will be applied on a 2020 tax balance from May 1 to 31, 2021.

This flexibility measure is intended to give Quebecers affected by the COVID-19 crisis more time to fulfill their tax responsibilities.
